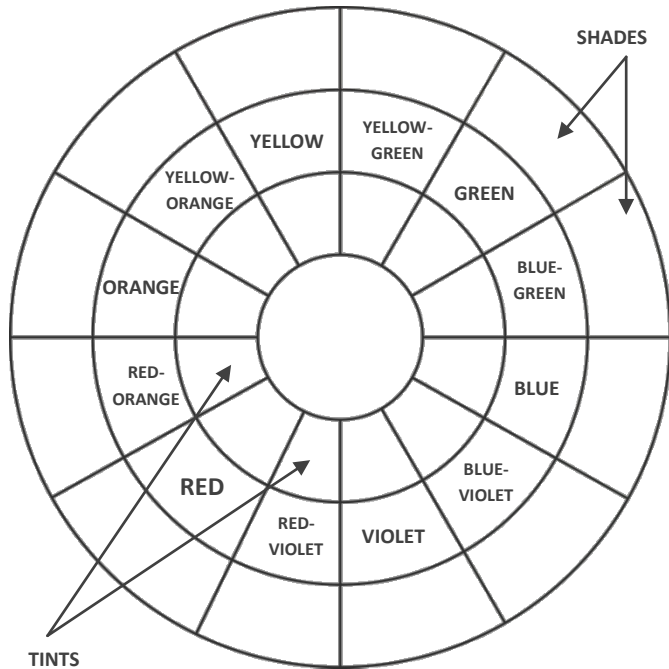


What Will I Learn in Seventh & Eighth Grade Art?

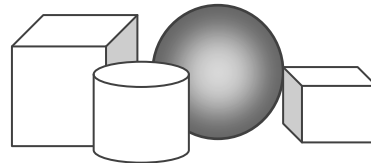
Color schemes: Monochromatic, Complementary, Triadic, Analogous, Spilt-Complementary

Color + white= Tint
 Color + black = Shade
 Color + gray= Tone

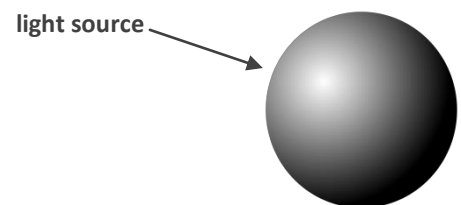
Intensity: The brightness or dullness of a color

Value: The lightness or darkness of a color
